What To Expect...

HOA Matters

- We work closely with clients who have acquired a new home with HOA (Homeowner Association) covenants requiring an application for a new landscape project.
- We are experienced with HOA guidelines in devising a portfolio for an application, which typically require: site plan, design rendering, description of plants with photos, existing features to remain, etc.
- Essentially, we take the hassle and worry out of your day by creating the application for you. All you do is submit the application to the HOA for approval.

Site Plan/ Design Rendering

- With your plot plan or measurements conducted by our team, we will know the size and dimensions of your property in order to plug it into our design rendering program.
- We will create a model of your property enabling you to view what your backyard could look like with patios, plants, sod, rock, mulch and more.
- We will devise a rough draft for you to view for your approval and make adjustments.
 Once approved, we can finalize the site plan and design rendering to be added to the landscape application.

Scheduling

- We will get you on the schedule once the landscape application has been approved.
- A basic backyard build generally requires one week to install.

Budgeting

- Basic build: \$10,000 and \$35,000.
- Intermediate build. \$35,000 and \$75,000.
- High-end custom build: \$75,000 and more.
- This can fluctuate up or down depending on certain features such as a paver patio, concrete pathway, retaining wall, outdoor kitchen, plant count, synthetic turf, etc.
- Costs are also dependent on how large of an area we are developing.

What To Consider...

Location

- Is your yard facing north or south? Most plants thrive in full sun, but there are a variety of plants that work in both sun and shade.
- How close are your neighbors? We can install privacy trees for more security.
- Depending on the wildlife in your area, we may need to consider plants that that are deer resistant. In contrast, we can install plants that attract birds, butterflies or bees.

Timing

- Certain plants bloom at certain times such as spring, summer and autumn. When
 installing plants we want to consider having a full spectrum of seasonal interest so
 that you have beautiful blooms all season long.
- We want to consider what plants will have winter interest such as evergreen shrubs vs. deciduous shrubs. What kind of plants will have colorful branches or fruit that persists into the winter?

Topography/ Drainage

- Is your yard generally level or does it have a steep slope? Does it dip in the center where water collects? Does your neighbor's yard drain into yours? The last thing we want to do is install sod or plants in an area that is not well drained.
- A solution is to install a French drainage system or develop a landscape design around drainage basins to ensure the overall health of the plants and functionality of the property.

Functionality

- We can install a concrete pathway with access from the front to the backyard with landscape lighting allowing visibility at night.
- We can install a hot tub or trashcan pad, fire pit, retaining wall, steps, etc.
- We can incorporate more grass for children and pets or a xeriscape with a low-maintenance and low-water design.

Deciduous Trees

What is a deciduous tree?

In the fields of horticulture and botany, the term deciduous means "falling off at maturity" and "tending to fall off", in reference to trees and shrubs that seasonally shed leaves, usually in the autumn with an array of different colors. During the winter the trees are bare.

Common types of deciduous trees that are generally available:

ORNAMENTAL:



Malus 'Spring Snow' Crabapple Tree (fruitless)

Bloom: Mid to late spring; white flowers

Foliage: Bright green; shiny Fall Color: Bright yellow

Height: 20' to 25'
Width: 15' to 20'
Growth: Moderate
Attracts: Butterflies; bees


Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water; drought-tolerant; low-maintenance

Comments:

One of our favorites! It is an ornamental tree with showy and fragrant white flowers in the Spring, which does *not* bear fruit. Meaning: no cleanup of tiny crabapples. Smells wonderful.

Malus 'Prairifire' Crabapple Tree



Foliage: Glossy maroon (spring), dark green (summer)

Fall Color: Burnt orange

Fruit: Small, dark-red purple fruit ½" in size

Height: 15' to 20'
Width: 15' to 20'
Growth: Moderate

Attracts: Butterflies; bees; songbirds eat fruit

Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water; drought-tolerant; low-maintenance

Comments:

Beautiful ornamental tree, which is purple/ pink/ red during the spring with fragrant blossoms followed by abundant, small fruit that remain on branches for months (less cleanup – plus, animals love these fruits, especially song birds).





Cleveland Flowering Pear (Pyrus calleryana 'Cleveland Select')

Bloom: Early spring
Foliage: Dark green; shiny
Fall Color: Purple to red-orange

Height: 25' to 30'
Width: 12' to 15'
Growth: Fast

Attracts: Butterflies; bees; song birds
Light Needs: Partial shade; partial to full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water; drought-tolerant; low-maintenance

Comments:

This tree is a perfectly uniform tree, growing in a tight, symmetrical shape without the need for pruning. It grows naturally in a clean oval. The Cleveland Pear resists damage from extreme snow, ice and wind, and pests, so there's virtually no maintenance.



NATIVE

Canada Red Chokecherry (Prunus virginiana 'Shubert')

Bloom: Mid to late spring; conical white flowers Foliage: Green in spring turning to burgundy

Fall Color: Burnt orange

Fruit: Small, dark-red fruit persists into summer

Height: 20' to 30' Width: 15' to 20' Growth: Moderate

Attracts: Butterflies; bees; songbirds eat fruit

Light Needs: Partial to full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water; very hardy

Comments:

A very hardy ornamental tree with early green leaves becoming maroon in late spring. Fragrant, white, spring flowers are followed by sweet purplish red fruit in summer. Excellent bird food. Canada Red is a very reliable tree for use in areas with extremely difficult conditions. It tolerates very cold, heat, wind, poor soil and fluctuating temperatures.



Japanese Ivory Silk Lilac (Syringa reticulata 'Ivory Silk')

Bloom: Spring to early summer; large creamy white flowers

Foliage: Green
Fall Color: Light yellow

Fruit: None
Height: 20' to 25'
Width: 15' to 20'
Growth: Slow

Attracts: Butterflies; bees; hummingbirds

Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water; drought-tolerant; low-maintenance

Comments:

Beautiful compact tree with HUGE flowers! This small tree produces footlong flower panicles with creamy white flowers that produce a sweet scent in late June. Once the blooms have finished, enjoy the beautiful shade from the Ivory Silk's large leaves. During the summer, the dark green foliage is a spectacular sight.



NATIVE

Autumn Brilliance Serviceberry (*Amelanchier x grandiflora*)

Bloom: Early spring; white flowers

Foliage: Bluish green

Fall Color: Bright red; orange

Fruit: Small, purplish fruit (edible – tastes like blueberries)

Height: 15' to 20'
Width: 15' to 20'
Growth: Fast

Attracts: Songbirds eat fruit

Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Very hardy; disease resistant; tolerates pollution

Comments:

This Colorado Native tree is an excellent, smaller tree with multi-season interest. It has very showy white flowers that precede a purplish edible fruit in June. It is a wonderful tree for bird watchers as birds flock to these delicious berries! This tree has excellent glossy blue-green leaves that turn brilliant red-orange in Autumn and are complemented by the smooth gray-colored stems. Very durable and resistant tree.



MEDIUM SHADE TREES:



Crimson Sunset Maple (Acer truncatum x platanoides)

Bloom: Early summer Foliage: Bergundy

Fall Color: Reddish purple

Fruit: None
Height: 30' to 35'
Width: 20' to 25'
Growth: Moderate
Attracts: Birds
Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water; drought-tolerant; low-maintenance

Comments:

Upright and compact form. Tolerant of a wide range of soils. Flourishes in the summer heat where few purple leafed plants will grow. High disease tolerance. Throughout growth, the crimson sunset maple maintains an upright, rounded crown, with compact structure.

Pacific Sunset Maple (Acer truncatum x platanoides 'Warrenred')



Foliage: Dark green Fall Color: Red; orange Fruit: None 25' to 30' Height: Width: 20' to 25' Growth: Moderate Birds Attracts: Light Needs: Full sun

Spring

Hardiness: Moderate water; drought-tolerant; low-maintenance

Comments:

Bloom:

Very unique tree with an array of fall colors (i.e., green, orange and red all at the same time). Its younger upright spreading habit matures into a rounded crown. Little pruning is needed. Strong branches to tolerate weather. Pest resistant. Amazing dark green glossy foliage in summer followed by beautiful multicolored fall color display.





Northern Catalpa (Catalpa speciosa)

Bloom: May and June; large clusters of white flowers

Foliage: Light green
Fall Color: Subtle yellow

Fruit: Bean-like seed pods that are 8–20" long and ¼–½" wide


Height: 40' to 50' Width: 25' to 30' Growth: Moderate

Attracts: Bees; hummingbirds

Light Needs: Partial shade to filtered or full sun
Hardiness: Moderate water; tolerates heat and cold

Comments:

This is a very unique tree, somewhat tropical looking, though is suited for Colorado! A hardy, interesting shade tree with giant, heart-shaped, light green leaves and big showy, white flowers followed by long bean-like seed pods persisting into winter. This tree is easy to grow and tolerates many conditions. Can develop a unique twist in branches and the trunk. Expected to begin flowering about 3-7 years after planting.



Green Spire Linden (Tilia cordata 'Greenspire')

Bloom: Early summer Foliage: Dark green Fall Color: Yellow to gold

Fruit: None
Height: 30' to 40'
Width: 25' to 35'
Growth: Moderate

Attracts: Bees; butterflies; birds

Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water; drought-tolerant; low-maintenance

Comments:

Slender, upturned branches create a dense, uniform crown with a conical outline. Tiny, yellow, fragrant flowers appear in early summer and small, heart-shaped, green leaves turn yellow in fall. Easy to grow.



Autumn Blaze Maple (Acer freemanii)

Bloom: Does not flower

Foliage: Green

Fall Color: Orange to crimson red

Fruit: None
Height: 40' to 50'
Width: 30' to 40'
Growth: Fast

Light Needs: Full sun to partial shade

Birds

Hardiness: Moderate water; drought-tolerant; low-maintenance

Comments:

Attracts:

This tree is prized for its crimson red foliage in the fall and for how fast it grows at 1 to 2 feet per year. This tree is a combination of the Red and Silver Maple trees.



New Horizon Elm (*Ulmus japonica x pumila 'New Horizon'*)

Foliage: Dark green
Fall Color: Rusty-red
Fruit: None
Height: 30' to 50'
Width: 25' to 30'

Growth: Fast
Attracts: Birds
Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Low water; extreme drought tolerance; hardy

Comments:

Bloom:

Fast-growing and vigorous. This tree would make a wonderful shade tree for a smaller yard. It has an upright habit, strong branch structure, and a dense crown.

LARGE SHADE TREES:



Common Hackberry (Celtis occidentalis)

Bloom: Spring
Foliage: Light Green
Fall Color: Yellow

Fruit: 1/3 to 1/2 inch berry-like fruit

Height: 50' to 60' Width: 40' to 50' Growth: Moderate

Attracts: Song birds; winter birds; butterflies

Light Needs: Partial to full sun

Hardiness: Low water needs; extremely drought-tolerant; hardy

Comments:

Extremely hardy shade tree with wide spread, upright arching branches and light green foliage creating an open, airy appearance. The foliage turns yellow in fall. Fruit is green, which ripens to red in fall and is edible for humans and animals.



Triumph Elm (Ulmus 'Morton Glossy')

Bloom: None

Foliage: Dark green
Fall Color: Yellow
Fruit: None
Height: 50' to 60'
Width: 45' to 50'
Growth: Fast
Attracts: Birds

Light Needs: Partial to full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water; drought-tolerant; low-maintenance

Comments:

Easily transplanted, quick to establish and regain rapid growth. Vase-shaped form. Very hardy!



Red Maple (Acer rubrum)

Bloom: Winter to Spring
Foliage: Dark green
Fall Color: Yellow to red

Fruit: None
Height: 40' to 60'
Width: 35' to 40'

Growth: Moderate to fast

Attracts: Birds and small mammals

Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water; low maintenance

Comments:

Brings color to your landscape year-round. Green stems turn red in winter, new leaves are red-tinged, turning to green. Fall color is deep red or yellow. Flowers are also red appearing in the winter. Fast growing and tolerant of many soils.



Bur Oak (Quercus macrocarpa)

Bloom: Spring
Foliage: Light Green

Fall Color: Golden; yellow

Fruit: Acorns
Height: 60' to 80'
Width: 70' to 80'
Growth: Moderate

Attracts: Birds and mammals

Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water needs; drought-tolerant

Comments:

A massive trunk, that is deeply grooved, supports wide spreading branches to create a majestic broad canopy. Large, heavy textured leaves are dark green turning to golden-yellowish brown in fall. Produces large acorns. Lives to 200 to 300 years.

PRIVACY TREES:



Crimson Spire Columnar Oak (Quercus robur 'Crimschmidt')

Bloom: None

Foliage: Dark green

Fall Color: Crimson; rusty red

Full sun

Fruit: Insignificant
Height: 30' to 40'
Width: 8' to 12'
Growth: Fast
Attracts: Birds

Hardiness: Moderate water; heat and cold tolerant

Comments:

Light Needs:

The dark green foliage turns to shades of red in autumn on this columnar shaped tree. The leaves will turn brown and may or may not persist through winter depending on weather conditions (i.e., instead of bare branches, the leaves will remain through the winter). The leaves are thick and lustrous and don't seem to be prone to insect infestation. A long lived tree that will provide many years of enjoyment.



Kindred Spirit Columnar Oak (Quercus x warei 'Nadler')

Bloom: None Foliage: Green Fall Color: Red

Fruit: Insignificant
Height: 30' to 40'
Width: 6' to 7'
Growth: Fast
Attracts: Birds
Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water; heat and cold tolerant

Comments:

Among the tightest of columnar trees, its growth habit, mildew and drought resistance, and tolerance of urban soils make this tree ideal for narrow spaces or for privacy screens. The leaves will turn brown and may or may not persist through winter depending on weather conditions (i.e., instead of bare branches, the leaves will remain through the winter).

Coniferous Trees

What is a conifer tree?

Coniferous trees are evergreen cone-shaped trees that are functional through more than one growing season. Essentially, the tree remains green, year-round, with needle-like leaves.

Common types of coniferous trees that are generally available:

NARROW:



Columnar Norway Spruce (Picea abies 'Cupressina')

Foliage: Medium to dark green

Height: 25' to 30'
Width: 6' to 8'
Growth: Moderate

Growth Habit: Dense and narrow Light Needs: Partial to full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water; deer resistant; low maintenance

Comments:

This tree works perfect for smaller yards with a max width of 8 feet. The dense, narrow growth requires no pruning and keeps the tree from being damaged from heavy snow.



NATIVE

Columnar Blue Spruce (Picea pungens 'Fastigiata')

Foliage: Silver-blue
Height: 25' to 30'
Width: 6' to 10'
Growth: Slow

Growth Habit: Dense and narrow Light Needs: Partial to full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water; deer resistant, low maintenance

Comments:

Very similar to the Columnar Norway Spruce (shown above). The dense, narrow growth is ideal for corners in small backyards. The blue color is a nice contrast to a majority of plants that are green.

Narrow conifers with *limited* availability:



Bosnian Pine (Pinus leucodermis)

Foliage: Green
Height: 20' to 25'
Width: 6' to 10'
Growth: Slow


Growth Habit: Dense and narrow

Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water; drought tolerant; low maintenance

Comments:

The needles grow tightly and dense. The narrow, slender habit of this tree makes it a good choice for small yards or narrow spaces.



Weeping White Spruce (Picea glauca 'Pendula')

Foliage: Blue-green
Height: 20' to 25'
Width: 4' to 6'
Growth: Moderate

Growth Habit: Narrow; weeping Light Needs: Partial to full sun

Hardiness: Low water; drought resistant; deer resistant

Comments:

A straight trunked tree with very pendulous branches. Lower branches skirt on the ground, a very stately, formal tree. Needles are green with a definite blue cast. A perfect choice for narrow spaces.

MEDIUM:



NATIVE

Colorado Baby Blue Spruce (Picea pungens 'Baby Blue')

Foliage: Silver-blue
Height: 15' to 25'
Width: 10' to 15'
Growth: Slow
Growth Habit: Pyramidal

Light Needs: Partial to full sun

Hardiness: Water weekly; moderate drought tolerance

Comments:

This Baby Blue spruce is a dense evergreen that features a distinctive pyramidal form. With their beautiful silvery-blue appearance, these trees allow you to use them as focal points in your yard.



NATIVE

Fat Albert Blue Spruce (Pinus leucodermis 'Satellite')

Foliage: Blue-green

Height: 10' to 15' in 10 years; 40' at maturity Width: 10' in 10 years; 20' at maturity


Growth: Slow Growth Habit: Pyramidal

Light Needs: Full to partial sun

Hardiness: Moderate watering; cold- and drought-tolerant

Comments:

Very dense, upright, broad-pyramidal conifer with good blue-green needle color. Trees exhibit full, dense growth even in youth. Being a grafted (cloned) tree it will show consistent form and color.



Austrian Pine (Pinus nigra)

Foliage: Dark green
Height: 30' to 40'
Width: 20' to 30'
Growth: Fast

Growth Habit: Dense and conical

Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Low water needs; very adaptive; very hardy

Comments:

Native tree that is adaptive to any type of soil with extreme cold hardiness and tolerant to dry conditions. Tolerable to windy conditions, which can act as a windbreak. Long, dark green needles and conical form are design-friendly creating a beautiful aesthetic to any landscape.



Black Hills Spruce (Picea glauca 'Densata')

Foliage: Dark green
Height: 20' to 30'
Width: 10' to 15'
Growth: Moderate

Growth Habit: Dense and conical Light Needs: Partial to full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water needs; very adaptive; low maintenance

Comments:

This tree is native to the Black Hills of South Dakota, also known as a White Spruce. A reliable performer for difficult and extreme conditions. Best in full sun but will tolerate some shade.

LARGE:



NATIVE

Pondarosa Pine (Pinus ponderosa)

Foliage: Dark green
Height: 50' to 80'
Width: 30' to 40'
Growth: Moderate

Growth Habit: Dense and conical

Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Low water needs; very adaptive; very hardy

Comments:

This tree is native to Colorado. When the tree is younger, it will have a broad conical shape. As they mature, it will have a more narrow appearance. The pine needles are found in bunches of two to three, and they will measure up to 10 inches long having a yellowish-green hue. The seeds in the pine cones provide food for birds and small mammals.

Colorado Blue Spruce (Picea glauca 'Densata')

Foliage: Silver blue-green

Height: 10' to 12' in 10 years; 40' to 60' at maturity

Width: 10' to 20' Growth: Slow Growth Habit: Pyramidal Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water; low maintenance

Comments:

Colorado State Tree, which is native to Colorado. Needles are 1.5" in length and produce a fresh pine scent. Performs best in a regularly irrigated area.

PRIVACY:



Spartan Juniper (Juniperus chinensis 'Spartan')

Foliage: Dark green
Height: 15' to 20'
Width: 4' to 6'
Growth: Fast

Growth Habit: Dense and narrow

Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Low water; drought resistant

Comments:

A handsome, fast growing evergreen that forms a stately, dark green, densely branched column well-suited for use as a formal accent, screen or windbreak. In its natural form, the symmetrical, pyramidal shape rarely needs pruning. Ideal for small spaces or a privacy hedge.



NATIVE

Wichita Blue Juniper (Juniperus scopulorum 'Wichita Blue')

Foliage: Silver-blue
Height: 15' to 20'
Width: 4' to 8'
Growth: Moderate
Growth Habit: Pyramidal
Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Low water; drought resistant

Comments:

Bright silver blue foliage on densely arranged, upright spreading branches, that flare outward creating a broad pyramidal juniper. Though deer aren't attracted to it, numerous birds will forage on the silvery blue berries in late summer and winter, providing a graceful show of wildlife.



NATIVE

Skyrocket Juniper (Juniperus scopulorum 'Skyrocket')

Foliage: Blue-green
Height: 15' to20'
Width: 3' to 4'
Growth: Moderate
Growth Habit: Upright
Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Low water needs; low maintenance

Comments:

Stately, columnar form makes this likely the narrowest juniper available so narrow and upright, in fact, it resembles a skyrocket! A durable and versatile evergreen with beautiful bluish green foliage, it works well grouped to form a colorful screen, or singly as a garden accent in a mixture of conifers. Requires very little care, once established.



Green Columnar Juniper (Juniperus chinensis 'Hetzii Columnaris')

Foliage: Dark green
Height: 12' to 15'
Width: 4' to 6'
Growth: Fast

Growth Habit: Pyramidal; upright

Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Low water needs; very hardy

Comments:

Super-tough and vigorous evergreen, perfect for difficult spots, poor, rocky soil, heat and drought. It has a strong pyramidal upright form, growing to 15 feet or more in a short time. The foliage is a rich dark-green that doesn't burn in sun or cold.

DWARF:



Tannenbaum Mugho Pine (Pinus mugho 'Tannenbaum')

Foliage: Green; hint of grey-blue

Height: 10' to 13'
Width: 5' to 7'
Growth: Slow

Growth Habit: Dense conical; pyramidal

Light Needs: Partial shade; partial sun to full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water needs

Comments:

This is a semi-dwarf tree. The needles are longer, in proportion to its size. Foliage is rich green with a hint of gray/blue, even during winter. Highly adaptable to a wide range of environmental and climatic conditions and very hardy.



NATIVE

Blue Sester's Dwarf (Picea pungens 'Sester Dwarf')

Foliage: Blue-grey
Height: 6' to 8'
Width: 3' to 4'
Growth: Slow

Growth Habit: Dense conical; pyramidal

Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water needs; low maintenance

Comments:

This tree has the classic Colorado Blue Spruce shape and color, but at about a quarter the size. Symmetrical, formal-looking tree with strong wood and dense foliage made up of short, square, bright blue needles. Excellent for a small garden bed.

Shrubs

What are shrubs?

A shrub is a small- to medium-sized perennial woody plant. Shrubs can be deciduous or evergreen. They are distinguished from trees by their multiple stems and shorter height, less than 15 feet tall and wide.

Common types of shrubs that are generally available:

GROUND COVER:



NATIVE

Pawnee Buttes Sandcherry (Prunus besseyi 'Pawnee Buttes')

Bloom: Early spring
Bloom Color: White flowers
Foliage: Green; evergreen
Fall Color: Red; burgundy

Fruit: Small black cherries (edible)

Height: 15" to 18"
Width: 4' to 6'
Growth: Moderate

Attracts: Butterflies; bees; birds

Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Low water; xeric; low maintenance

Comments:

During the springtime, you can expect to see fragrant, white flowers blooming on this shrub. When summer arrives, the flowers will make way for black cherries. In the fall, its thick green leaves will turn bright red and purple. When it matures, this species forms into a rounded shape.

Buffalo Juniper (Juniperus sabina 'Buffalo')



Bloom: None

Foliage: Bright green; evergreen

Height: 12" or less Width: 6' to 8' Growth: Moderate

Light Needs: Partial shade to full sun

Hardiness: Low water; very hardy; low maintenance

Comments:

A common groundcover evergreen for home landscape and garden use with consistent bright green foliage all season long. It is a low growing, wide spreading and densely branched, which forms a mound. Can live up to 30 years long!







NATIVE

Kinnikinnick (Arctostaphylos uva-ursi)

Bloom: Spring

Bloom Color: White to pink lantern-shaped flowers

Foliage: Evergreen; dark green; glossy

Fall Color: Red-gold; burgundy

Fruit: Small red berries; persists into winter

Height: 6" to 12"
Width: 3' to 6'
Growth: Slow

Attracts: Birds; butterflies; hummingbirds

Light Needs: Partial to full sun

Hardiness: Low water; xeric; low maintenance

Comments:



This plant gets its name from long and wispy seed heads that develop every summer- the pinkish shades create an impression of lingering smoke. The small, pink bud-like flowers also add more depth to the color. In the fall the foliage takes on purple, red and orange hues, then remains a burgundy shade for the winter.



Native plant! A colorful, fuss-free border plant and excellent choice for cut flowers. Bright, daisy-like, golden yellow flowers with black centers cover the dark green foliage. Tolerates heat, humidity, and clay soil.

Native! Foliage is finely divided and bright green with a fern-like appearance. Foliage is aromatic and not palatable to most herbivores including deer. White or pink flat topped flower clusters are held above the foliage. The flowers are compound corymbs that consist of 20 or more individual florets.

Comments:

This perennial is perfect for a shady spot! Has soft green leaves with white bands, making it very striking. The flowers bloom from July to August. These plants provide bright color in shade with wonderful foliage.





Purple Emperor Stonecrop (Sedum Purple Emperor)

This plant is specifically bred for the striking colors of both foliage and flowers that it produces year-round. The flowers start off as tiny, light-pink clusters, then they open and flatten, getting to be 5 to 6 inch wide bunches that attract many pollinators. While the flowers fade come fall, the foliage holds interest all year long. Prune back in spring to promote growth.

Peonies have lush flowers that are extremely showy and fragrant with some varieties living longer than 100 years. After its stunning bloom, the peonies bushy clump of glossy green leaves that lasts all summer, turning purplish-red or gold in the fall.





Scarlet Bee Balm (Monarda didyma)

Bloom: Mid- to late-summer

Height: 2' to 4'
Width: 2' to 3'
Growth: Moderate

Attracts: Butterflies; bees; hummingbirds

Light Needs: Partial shade to full sun

Comments:

A dense, rounded, terminal, head-like cluster of bright red, tubular flowers atop a square stem. Scarlet beebalm is a popular perennial with scarlet-red flowers in terminal tufts. The 3 ft. stems are lined with large, oval, dark-green leaves. Individual flowers are narrowly tube-shaped, tightly clustered together in 2 in. heads. The leaves have a minty aroma.





Cone Flower (Echinacea purpurea)

A popular perennial with long-lasting, lavender flowers. Rough, scattered leaves that become small toward the top of the stem. Flowers occur singly atop the stems and have domed, purplish-brown, spiny centers and drooping, lavender rays. An attractive perennial with purple drooping rays surrounding a spiny, brownish central disk.





Border Bearded Iris (Iris germanica)

Height: 12" to 18"; 28" with bloom

Growth: Fast growing

Attracts: Butterflies; bees; hummingbirds

Comments:

They grow as upright plants with bluish-green, sword-shaped leaves. In late spring, the showy, large flowers bloom on sturdy stalks above leaves. They get their name from the "beards" that resemble fuzzy caterpillars on the downward petals.

Native, therefore highly adaptable to both high heat and low temperatures, this is a very hardy plant. Cut back throughout season to further promote growth and prevent self-seeding. A very easy plant to grow, deer resistant and good erosion control.

The striking blueish-purple flowers sit atop slender, tall stems with narrow leaves; they open each morning and close every night. This is a very easygoing plant that needs little maintenance, although pruning is good for ideal aesthetic purposes. In mid to late summer, the seed capsules harden and darken to be harvested, having many uses.

There are many variants of color for this plant. There is a general cup shaped flower with thin, billowy petals of one color and the base being another color. Seedpods come after the flowers and these are good for either cut, dried flower arrangements, or left in the garden for fall and winter decoration.





Snow Fountain Gaura (Gaura lindheimeri Walsnofou)

Bloom: Late spring to fall

Foliage: Green
Flower color: White
Height: 24" to 36"
Width: 16" to 18"
Growth: Fast growing
Attracts: Butterflies; bees

Light Needs: Full sun

Hardiness: Moderate water; low maintenance

Comments:

Known as a dancing flower, these beautiful white blooms last from late spring through fall. These blooms sit on tight and sturdy stems, allowing them to grow tall and strong. It is deer resistant blooms all season long.





Sunset Hyssop (Agastache rupestris)

Foliage: Dark green
Flower color: Orange
Height: 12" to 36"

Attracts: Hummingbirds

Comments:

The fine-textured gray-green leaves can be used to make herbal tea. In the summertime the plant is covered with trumpet shaped flowers that range in shades of pink, purple and orange. Cut to almost ground at beginning of spring to promote further growth.




